Since 2012, SHINE and its partners have invested more than £1.4 million in Teacher-led programmes that have benefitted thousands of students.

To date, over 50 Teachers have been awarded funding to ensure their creative ideas are supported.

So what types of ideas are we looking to fund? Here are a couple of examples:

Gavin Summerfield: Gavin applied to Let Teachers SHINE in 2015 with his project, Robotics Storytelling Club, a project which helps children to learn how to program and tell stories using Nao Robot technology.

This year SHINE is supporting Gavin to build on the success of the Robotics Storytelling Club and replicate it across 14 schools over the next 2 years in the London Borough of Bexley.

Michelle Lockwood: Michelle won a grant in 2016 to develop "Spelling Beats", a project that addresses spelling – the most common problem she has experienced amongst students who struggle with their literacy. Michelle is creating rhymes, raps and mnemonics to help students remember each spelling rule quickly and with enjoyment.

This year, 'Spelling Beats' will become a website available to all, with recordings, activities, and clear plans for teachers to use in their own classrooms.
