### **NEW Schools for Success**

### **NEW STEM**

We will soon be announcing exciting STEM activities following on from last year's STEM Roundtable. These aim to drive up teachers' understanding of STEM careers in London, challenge pervasive gender stereotypes, and boost the numbers of young Londoners taking part in real life science projects.

Applications are now open for organisations to lead the Mayor's **Early Years Hubs**. The hubs will bring schools, childminders, and Private Voluntary and Independent nurseries together to improve access to quality early years education and childcare for London's most disadvantaged families. ### **Getting Ahead London: creating London's next headteachers**

**Getting Ahead London** is in its second year helping talented senior leaders to become future heads or principals. A positive evaluation of the pilot year which is published shows that one third of the 60 participants getting promotions and one quarter being offered headships already. It will include a London Teacher Training Map to attract more trainees and set out some of the great benefits of developing your teaching career in London.

### **London Ambitions**

Across London young people don't always get the careers advice they need. We have worked with London Councils, London's local enterprise partnership and others to develop the London Ambitions careers offer. This sets out key recommendations to help to transform the landscape of careers and employment support for young people. To support schools and colleges the Mayor:

- Produced the **London Ambitions portal** which makes it easy for schools, colleges and employers to connect – providing experience of the world of work for 4-18 years olds. - Leads London's **Enterprise Adviser** programme, which is delivered by Team London on behalf of The Careers and Enterprise Company. It works with teachers to develop and implement a whole school careers education plan through matching them with volunteers from the world of work. - Developed 12 **Careers Clusters**. Funded by the European Social Fund, they are working with senior leadership teams to design high quality careers education offers for secondary schools and FE colleges. Careers Clusters are piloting sustained employer activities for pupils, helping teachers

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understand London's job opportunities and matching and supporting pupils into work placements and internships.

## Youth Innovation Fund

We have launched two new Youth Innovation Fund projects. These support young people aged 16 to 24 into sustained employment, education or training. They are running over a 3-year period. Dame Kelly Holmes Trust is working in partnership with London South East Colleges to deliver **Getting Back on Track**. This helps young people who have recently dropped out from their level 2/3 studies at school or college. **Care Leavers into Work** is led by Drive Forward Foundation and is supporting care leavers into sustained employment in Lambeth, Hackney and Haringey. It provides intensive one-to-one support, mentoring and employability training programmes to improve the independence, self-confidence and work readiness of care leavers.

## London Curriculum

It supported 11 projects across the capital, all seeking to raise pupil attainment by creating fantastic new teaching resources.
